<u>Inspiration/Theme:</u> Children in the Foundation Stage learn best and most effectively when they are given the opportunity to explore, investigate and learn about things that interest them. At The Mead Academy Trust we give children the freedom to follow their own lines of enquiry by planning a skills based curriculum. Themes may last a day, a week or even a half term depending on where the children take their learning. As the children settle in to school and new routines our focus will be based around hearing and sharing stories, retelling them in lots of ways and developing language.
